Setting:

The game takes place in the eerie and enigmatic Blackwood Manor, a sprawling estate filled with secrets, hidden passageways, and a storm raging outside. The year is 1928, and the setting is a high-society dinner party hosted by the wealthy but controversial Lord Reginald Blackwood. Before dessert is served, Lord Blackwood is found dead in the library, and it's up to the guests to uncover the murderer!

Characters (Roles for Players):

Each character has a detailed backstory, secrets, and motives that may or may not connect to the murder. Guests take on these roles and use clues to uncover the truth.

Plot Introduction:

The guests arrive at Blackwood Manor for a formal dinner hosted by Lord Reginald Blackwood. Tension fills the air as past grievances and secrets bubble beneath the surface. When dessert is about to be served, the lights flicker, and a scream echoes from the library. Guests rush in to find Lord Blackwood dead, slumped over his desk. The doors are locked, and the storm ensures no one can leave.

Objective:

Guests must work together—and against each other—to uncover clues and piece together what happened. Was it a crime of passion, revenge, or greed? Everyone is a suspect, and everyone has something to hide.

Gameplay Clue Cards:

Throughout the game, players receive clue cards with evidence (e.g., a torn letter, a bloody candlestick, a missing heirloom) and information. Some clues are truthful, while others are red herrings.

Interrogation Rounds:

Players take turns questioning each other, trying to uncover lies and motives while protecting their own secrets.

Hidden Objectives:

Each character has a personal objective (e.g., recover evidence, protect another guest, or sabotage the investigation).

The Big Reveal:

At the end of the game, players present their theories, and the real murderer is revealed (pre-determined by the host, or chosen based on gameplay).

Twist Ending:

The murder was not as straightforward as it seemed. Perhaps the murderer was acting under duress, or perhaps multiple guests conspired to kill Reginald—each believing they acted alone.

This plot allows for creative twists and turns that will keep players guessing until the very end!

Margaret Finch

Role: The loyal housekeeper who has worked at Blackwood Manor for decades.

Motive: Margaret recently discovered Reginald was planning to fire her after years of service.

Secret: She overheard a crucial conversation on the night of the murder.

Lady Eleanor Blackwood

Role: The grieving (and possibly opportunistic) widow.

Motive: Eleanor stands to inherit Blackwood Manor and its vast fortune—if Reginald's death is ruled "accidental."

Secret: She's been having an affair with one of the guests.

Dr. Beatrice Hawthorne

Role: The family doctor and trusted confidante.

Motive: Reginald recently accused Beatrice of mismanaging his health and was planning to cut ties with her.

Secret: She knows a secret about Lord Blackwood's will.

Vivienne DuBois

Role: A glamorous actress and Reginald's former lover.

Motive: Reginald ended their relationship and embarrassed her publicly.

Secret: She has been blackmailing someone at the party.

Archibald "Archie" Sinclair

Role: A charming journalist covering Reginald's business dealings.

Motive: Archie's exposé on Reginald's shady dealings was suppressed by Reginald himself

Secret: He has been gathering dirt on nearly everyone at the party.

Sebastian Blackwood

Role: The rebellious son of Reginald and Eleanor.

Motive: Sebastian clashed with his father over inheritance and his refusal to fund Sebastian's gambling debts.

Secret: He was seen arguing with his father moments before the murder.

Inspector Arthur Graves

Role: A guest who happens to be an offduty detective.

Motive: Arthur was investigating Reginald for illegal activities and may have wanted to silence him.

Secret: Arthur is hiding his connection to another guest.

Charles Montgomery

Role: A shady businessman and Reginald's business partner.

Motive: Charles and Reginald had a falling out over a failed investment.

Secret: He was embezzling money from their company.
